



The Beehive: A Masonic Symbol By David J. Reilly

I am reminded of a Poem that a Mentor of mine used to say regarding Bees by Isaac Watts (1674-1748) How Doth the Little Busy Bee

*How doth the little busy bee
Improve each shining hour,
And gather honey all the day
From every opening flower!*

The beehive is a symbol associated with life, creativity, hard work, community service, prosperity, and plenty. Religion shares with us that bees represent the human soul while the hive represents the human body and the honey symbolizes the rich inner life we can enjoy within ourselves. The beehive itself symbolizes collaboration between busyness and productivity. The bees place all their energy into one common cause. The Beehive is a Masonic symbol and adapts its meaning to the ideals of creativity, hard work and the ideal of industrious performance.

Freemasons are to be industrious, work, and protect the common good. A beehive is a factory. It is a business within itself as it is an organization composed of bees, resources and supplies who utilize their innate learning to provide honey. While doing this they provide a byproduct of propagating flowers. Bees are essential for the health of people and our world. Honey and other products have medicinal properties, and the role of bees as pollinators makes them vital for food supplies. They are crucial to humanity. There are 20,000 species of bees around the world and 2,000 in the United States. Yet man is only studying a small number of these species. There are three kinds of bees in a hive. The Queen, the worker, and the forager. A bee will protect its own. There are studies that show when bees are stuck in the honey and unable to fly away, other bees will assist in eating the honey away, freeing the bee in question. A bee will defend the hive until death. A Bee has a stinger in its lower abdomen with poison sacks attached. When a bee stings, the lower abdomen will break away and the stinger will pump the poison into its victim for up to a minute. Bees are our friends for what they provide humanity and the animal world. Bees communicate not through buzzing of wings but through the “waggle dance,” they do not make a verbal noise. Bees provide many additives to medicines including pollen, honey and propolis. “Food for thought!” Pun intended!!!!

Checking Ourselves at the West Gate

When a profane traveler presents himself at the West Gate it is up to the members of the lodge to decide if the candidate for membership is worthy. In this case worthy refers to admirable qualities of the individual. Every Mason is a man, but every man is not a Mason. We are reminded in our Masonic Studies that it is important that the candidate “must be conformable to our rules; that the honor, glory and reputation of the institution may be firmly established” within the candidate. It is paramount that during visitations, petition committee, and petition readings, the lodge be diligent during the waiting time.

When a Master Mason presents himself at the west gate upon entering the Lodge, a mental inventory of like questions and thoughts should remind the member of his obligation. It is important for the Lodge to supply Masonic education and mentorship throughout his Masonic journey. Just as important is for the Master Mason, during his Masonic studies to be receptive and to strive in the System of Morality to apply himself to seek Masonic attributes that are learned through the allegory and presentation of symbols. To achieve these, it is needed for the man to decide his strengths and weaknesses and question his behaviors.

Freemasonry supplies a framework of positive instruction in its lessons, for the man who will take the time to learn. Guidance is given and provided by study materials and members of the Lodge who aid through counsel and example. Freemasonry supplies avenues of brotherhood, and Master Masons find contentment in the Craft Lodge and or Appendant bodies. Those who stay in the Craft Lodge will find involvement and contentment working on committees, ritual work, officer line, as well as an observer. Those who accept leadership roles find themselves once again being tried. Their personalities and attributes will be called on to expand and support the craft. This is a time when the Master Mason sees himself in the rough, and striving to make himself and the Lodge befitting.

Masonic attributes are evaluated as well as ego and integrity. Time as a Mason will hone lodge ability. Continuing to develop a self-portrait will supply mentoring and being able to use an instructive tongue and an attentive ear.

The tenets of Freemasonry are sacred and intended for participation. Members should never take part in hate, discontent, or gossip about lodge members or other lodges. Those that do have forgotten or never learned their Masonic Obligations. Leaders who act with “gotcha moments” and threaten with district officers and Masonic Charges when dealing with Lodge business, and disagreements, should have been halted at the West Gate and denied entrance.

Members come to the Lodge to avoid the day-to-day rigors of life. The Lodge is a sanctuary, a place of solitude where a member can come break bread and interact with likeminded men. A place where men meet on the same plane or level and avoid topics of discourse which lead to argument and dissent. It supplies a time of fellowship, and a period to draw information and dialog to renew one’s boundaries, a place to level, plumb and square in harmony. A true Mason finds Freemasonry to be demanding work and the learning process, reading, watching degrees listening to speakers and mentors never ends. The work is that of looking at oneself, assessing and reassessing, answering, and questioning. There are no correct answers, self-interrogations are those that the individuals weigh and accept. Freemasonry is an anvil, and the Masons intellect, spirit, and emotions are hammered as Damascus steel.

Remember to examine and reexamine yourself at the West Gate. The profane see you as a Mason with all the Masonic attributes, tenants, behaviors, we strive to sustain.


