





Installation of 2024 Harmonia Lodge Officers



Lodge Secretary - Duties

The Secretary's Lodge Officer Duties require a high degree of lodge experience, Masonic knowledge, diplomacy, and, above all, detailed paperwork skills.

The Lodge Secretary is the backbone of any Masonic Lodge and he holds a position of great responsibility. He sits to the left of the Master.

His duties require him to handle all correspondence to the members, minutes of Lodge meetings, petitions of new candidates, continuous lodge member count, and many other administrative duties. He compiles an ongoing list of each new candidate and which degrees that candidate has undertaken. From his member list, he sends out the annual dues notices and receives dues payments.

He communicates with other Lodges and the Grand Lodge, types letters, retrieves the mail as well as handles many other details.

The Secretary's Lodge Officer duties are many, not the least of which is that he must be well versed in Grand Lodge By-Laws for his jurisdiction and his individual Lodge By-Laws. He keeps the list of Lodge members and helps the Master organize his meetings.

A very experienced member usually resides in this chair ... many times he is a Past Master of the Lodge.

While it is not a prerequisite, due to the number of hours that this position requires, most (not all) Lodge Secretaries are retired and therefore able to devote the many hours required which are necessary to this position.

The Secretary's position is similar to a corporate C.O.O., {Chief Operation Officer}.

There was another meeting, and I will remind you. Once upon a time in my mind I belonged to a Lodge. I had joined and attended, I didn't care about the cost or the distance I needed to travel to get to the Lodge. I entered on the level, parted on the square and was always treated on the Plumb and as an upright Mason. The fellowship is euphoric, the meetings are knowledgeable and entertaining, and the food really doesn't come into play except on special meetings. Members do not try to outdo one another, and ego, pettiness and daily cares are left outside. It was a joy to be with like-minded men and men whose values were held high, and we all felt a joy to be there together.

From the West Gate, upon entering the Lodge, I would see brothers conversing and raising questions on Masonic meanings, Ritual, and enjoying the unity of brotherhood. There was no gossip for there was no verbal communication, it was all done in mental telepathy and kept on the plumb. Upon arriving at ENMI Lodge, more than one brother would introduce and welcome members and visitors alike. It was not uncommon to meet a visitor or brother from another time or place. At this meeting the Gift Bringers of Gift Bringing was a guest of the Lodge. He entered and found harmony prevailing and many Brothers surrounded him with so many questions. He was ushered to a chair and seemed to know he was to feel at home. He rested his legs on a chair and noted there was no fireplace. He thought there should be a fireplace and with a twinkle of his eye and laying his finger beside his nose, a roaring fireplace appeared. The kind that not only warms the body but also the soul. He began with a little History of St Nicholas. St Nicholas was from the 4th Century in a town of Myra, Turkey. He had become famous for his kindness. He was known to place coins in the windows of the poor and was noted to give to the children. The legend goes he saved three girls from slavery by throwing coins in their window. He rescued sailors from storms, freed innocent prisoners, and defended the orthodox faith against heretics and persecutors. Someone asked how Santa Claus evolved. Kris Kringle remarked that St Nick evolved in many countries and was depicted in many images. He was known as Kris Kringle, Father Christmas, and the Dutch called him Sinterklaas. Germany called him Wodan and celebrated a time called Yule.

Santa Claus was first used in 1773 in the U.S. Press, but lost his bishop's apparel, and was at first pictured as a thick-bellied Dutch sailor with a pipe in a green winter coat. A Visit from St. Nicholas, more commonly known as The Night Before Christmas and 'Twas the Night Before Christmas from its first line, is a poem first published anonymously under the title Account of a Visit from St. Nicholas in 1823 and later attributed to Clement Clarke Moore, who claimed authorship in 1837. Moore defined his appearance in the poem and stayed from that date to the present. The belief in Santa Claus has reached the questioning of every child between his seventh and eighth birthday. It was no different for Virginia. "Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus" is a line from an editorial by Francis Church titled "Is There a Santa Claus?", which appeared in the New York newspaper The Sun on September 21, 1897. This derived from the newspaper and met the question in the belief of Santa Claus. A letter was sent to the Sun Newspaper of New York by an 8-year-old girl named Virginia. The reporter answered Virginia and it was published. The answer was "Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus." Coca-Cola began to use the red image of Santa on advertising in the 1930s, when Coca-Cola hired an artist, Haddon Sunbloom to create a character of Santa Claus for use in festive campaigns. Well, here I am today. Question pursued, how many reindeer, how do they fly, how do you deliver everywhere in one night. Santa took the questions one by one, there are 8 reindeer, Rudolph is the ninth and is used on foggy or poor weather flights. The reindeer fly using magic food that is added into their diet all the month of December. Incidentally their favorite snack is a rye crisp. Delivering all in one night is a time consortium, it includes the alignment of the planets, the window of time I leave, along with sleigh weight and a ratio of nice and naughty. My question to Santa was do you sleep with your whiskers under the covers or outside the covers. I hadn't heard a Ho Ho Ho like that, and he said outside the covers because it makes them grow. It was a great night. He handed out candy canes, and as fast as the fireplace appeared, he left. We stood around looking and thinking, Santa Claus should be a freemason for he processes all the principles and tenets, and incidentally many of reaffirmed our belief in Santa that night.

My Lodge continues and we are blessed with Masonic principles and tenets, as well as the many enlightened visitors who share my Lodge and share such interesting facts. I am reminded at each meeting of my obligations and the charges we received during the Masonic Degrees. I am reminded of the duties each mason is charged with, to God, his neighbor and himself. I remind myself I am not to enter countering with the profane concerning Freemasonry. Nor am I to allow or encourage membership of those who will not conform to the Masonic teachings or rules. The lodge always and continues to entertain guests of my lodge, not only famous, but men as ourselves. Those who like me strive to be better: better men, better husbands, fathers and Masons.

Poinsettia (Pronounced- poyn zet tia)


The plant we know today as the Poinsettia has a long and interesting history. Native to Central America, the plant flourished in an area of Southern Mexico known as Taxco del Alarcon, and was known as the flower of the night. The Aztecs used the plant for decorative purposes but also put the plant to practical use. They extracted a purplish dye for use in textiles and cosmetics from the plant's bracts. The milky white sap, today called latex, was made into a preparation to treat fevers.

The Poinsettia may have remained a regional plant for many years to come had it not been for the efforts of Joel Roberts Poinsett (1779-1851). The son of a French physician, Brother Joel Poinsett was appointed as the first United States Ambassador to Mexico (1825-1829) by President Madison. Poinsett had attended medical school himself, but his real love in the scientific field was botany. (Mr. Poinsett later founded the institution which we know today as the Smithsonian Institution).

Poinsett maintained his own hothouses on his Greenville, South Carolina plantations, and while visiting the Taxco area in 1828, he became enchanted by the brilliant red blooms he saw there. He immediately sent some of the plants back to South Carolina, where he began propagating the plants and sending them to friends and botanical gardens. It is unclear when Poinsett joined the Masonic fraternity. It is documented that he served as Worshipful Master of Recovery Lodge No. 31 in Greenville, South Carolina, and Solomon's Lodge No. 1 in Charleston, South Carolina. He was also a Royal Arch Mason and was elected Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of South Carolina, serving until 1841.


