The Masonic Blue Slipper Pin Information gathered by David J. Reilly

The little blue slipper pin is a pin shaped as a little blue slipper. The tradition of having a wife, sister, or daughter of a Mason to wear one on their dress or coats began in England and became popular in America in the 30s, 40s and 50s during boom in train travel, and when women traveled alone. Masons on trains, Masons who were conductors and in towns would see the pin and would offer help to those recognized as Masonic Family. It symbolized the confirmation of a spoken promise or deed. The shoe is the symbol of a promise, and the Masonic blue color is a symbol of perfection. The blue of the sky does not fade and is everlasting. ("The History of the Masonic Blue Slipper - LaFayette Lodge #199") The Masonic Blue Slipper represents that this woman is the relative of a Mason and is thereby under the protection of all Masons and the unfading oath of all Masons to protect widows and orphans. (From Lafayette Lodge Np. 199 Lockhaven, Pa)

The symbolism comes from the Bible, specifically the Book of Ruth. In the story, a man named Elimelech took his wife Naomi and their two sons out of Bethlehem to the land of Moab. Then, after the two sons were married, Elimelech and both of Naomi's sons died. Naomi returned to Bethlehem with her widowed daughter-in-law Ruth. They were able to stay with a relative of Elimelech's named Boaz, who had a farm outside of town. Boaz fell in love with Ruth, but due to the laws at the time, this was a little bit complicated.


Boaz set up court at the city gate (as was the custom) and asked the closest relative of Elimelech to settle all his accounts (settle the debts of his death). When the relative could not take care of everything in the estate, Boaz stepped forward and said he would take care of the entire estate. ("The History of the Masonic Blue Slipper - LaFayette Lodge #199") As was the custom, the relative removed his shoe and offered it to Boaz to seal the deal. Boaz accepted the shoe and held it up for the crowd to symbolize that the deal had been made.

The Masonic Blue Slipper Pin (Continued)

"Boaz was then able to take Ruth as his wife, and their son Obed became the father of Jesse and the grandfather of King David." ("The History of the Masonic Blue Slipper -Lafayette Lodge #199")

There have been many stories of Masons recognizing brothers from all around the world. My wife went to India to work setting up a call center. We had no idea what she would encounter. I placed a Slipper Pin in her hand and told her to wear it as she traveled. When she returned, she did not say anyone recognized it, but she told me of the care she received in the Hotel. Hotel Personnel watched as she was leaving the Hotel and asked where she was going. They told her it was not safe. A man followed her in the Hotel, and the next thing she knew the man was escorted out of the Hotel. She wore it as she traveled to and from the call center. One evening while sick she called down to the desk and she was treated as a Princess with room service. In the Morning, while others received Menus, she was asked what she would like for breakfast? Was it the Masonic Pin or was it the relationship she had with the people in India and herself. Knowing my Wife, I would say it was both.

I WOULD STRONGLY SUGGEST as your Wife, Mother, Sister, or daughter travels, she wear a slipper pin. This pin has also been used as a Widows pin, however there is clearly an added advantage to all Masonic ladies in the wearing of the Masonic Blue Slipper Pin.



Two Sacks

This book is a Historical Fiction account of a German -Swiss family of three generations ages 2 thru 69. The Family were farmers and immigrated to America in 1803. The family decided to leave Canton Bern to move to Mississippi to grow cotton. Their story begins in decision making and travel on the Rhine River across the Atlantic and arriving in Philadelphia. The Author wrote of the trials as they gain free passage on a ship bound for America by agreeing to be sold into servitude. Jeff Ishee, the author, tells of the family being split up and taking the Great Wagon Road from Philadelphia through to the Carolinas. He speaks of Blue Lick or Roanoke where the Great Wagon Road splits into the Cumberland Road for settlers who went into Tennessee, Kentucky and farther west. He illustrates the trials, hardships, and tragedies along the way. The book ends as the remaining family gets passports to cross Alabama from Georgia and make it to Mississippi. This book is recommended for historians and those who are interested in the early byways of America.

It is 288 pages long and well worth the read.

Hamsa -Not a Masonic Symbol by D. J. Reilly

The Hamsa is seen as a Judaic and Hindu symbol, but history informs us that the Hamsa is a symbol that is represented by Judaism, Islam, Buddhism, and Christianity. "The meaning of Hansa is a league or group originally constituted of merchants of various free German cities dealing abroad in the medieval period and later of the cities themselves and organized to secure greater safety and privileges in trading."

The Hamsa is a depiction of the hand. It may be a line drawing and, in many instances, decorated in silver, gold and ornate precious and semi-precious stones. It is a symbol that may be worn by male and female or is used quite often as home décor. It may be displayed palm up or palm down. It may be depicted with an eye in the palm of the hand or without.

The hand pictures the palm with five fingers extended, and each finger has a meaning.

The five fingers in Islam represents the five pillars of Islam: (faith, fasting, pilgrimage, prayer, and tax.)

The Five fingers in Judaism represent the Torah, or first five books of the bible.

In Islam the Hansa represents the hand of Fatima, in Judaism the Hand of Meriam, in Christianity the Hand of Mary, and it may also represent the hand of God. In Hindu and Hamesh Buddhism, the five fingers represent the chakras. The Hamsa is also believed to be represented of the goose or swan.


Thumb: solar plexus chakra and fire (Agni)

Index finger: heart chakra and air (Vaayu)

Middle finger: throat chakra and space/ether (Akasa)

Ring finger: root chakra and earth (Prithvi)

Pinkie finger: sacral chakra and water (Apas)



In closing, this report of the Hamsa is not a belief you need to adhere to. It is simply a report on the education of symbols and a vehicle for you to know about them.
