## *Instructive Tongue*

Although his name is known to Freemasons as the King of Tyre, he was in fact the King of the Phoenicians whose ships spread their culture, knowledge and wealth throughout the ancient world and established cities such as Carthage and Utica on the north coast of Africa. There were even stories of the Phoenicians sailing to England and extracting Tin, which is a component of Bronze, from various places including Cornwall.

With the Phoenicians being skilled in the art of metal working, stone working, and other trades, it stands to reason that Solomon would choose a king and his people to help him in achieving his goal of building a temple to the Lord God of the Hebrew nation. The greatest assistance that Hiram, King of Tyre, gave King Solomon was the numerous skilled workmen who built the temple and especially the famous Masonic master craftsman Hiram Abiff.

Many people today believe that the King Hiram of Tyre and the slain master are one in the same, while some believe that they are father and son, and yet others believe that they are in fact two completely different people. There is no doubt this area will be explored by researchers for many years with numerous opinions expressed on the matter.

Nothing more is known about the great king except that his kingdom was to grow, flourish, and influence other nations for about another 700 years until it was invaded by Alexander the Great in about 400 BCE. Located at Hanawai Village, South-West Lebanon, is a tomb believed to be that of Hiram, King of Tyre.

***Perilous Fight* by Dr. Ben Carson**  
***Copyright 2024 (202 pages)***

All Freemasons should read this book, as it clarifies many of our values and what is happening to our American values. Dr. Carson begins with the ideals of what makes up our country's values, how we were, and strive to be self-sufficient by using grit, determination, courage, diversity, and pride in the promise of America. He places in print what many have thought but have never seen in writing. Dr. Carson begins with the Bible, details the meaning of Family, and goes on to explain the importance of Family. He explains how the family has been lost. He continues in explanation of how cable news and social media have led to loss of traditional values. This has been compounded by rampant apathy, appeasement, decrease of morals, sexual promiscuity, disrespect for others, hatred, lack of patriotism and decreased faith, which has resulted in the failure of the traditional family unit. He speaks of the Founding Fathers, and their take on family and freedom of Religion. He reminds us that in 1958, The Naked Communist, by W. Cleon Skousen, speaks of how communism does not need to take over America, that we will do it ourselves. Those failures that have struck our Values are doing just that. Once upon a time in my mind I belonged to a Lodge. I joined and attended. I did not care about the cost or the distance. I needed to travel to get to the Lodge. I entered on the level, parted on the square and was always treated on the Plumb and as an upright Mason. The fellowship is euphoric, the meetings are knowledgeable, entertaining, and the food really does not come into play except at extraordinary events. Members do not try to outdo one another, and ego, pettiness and daily cares are left outside. It was a joy to be with like-minded men with integrity, character, and men whose values were held high.

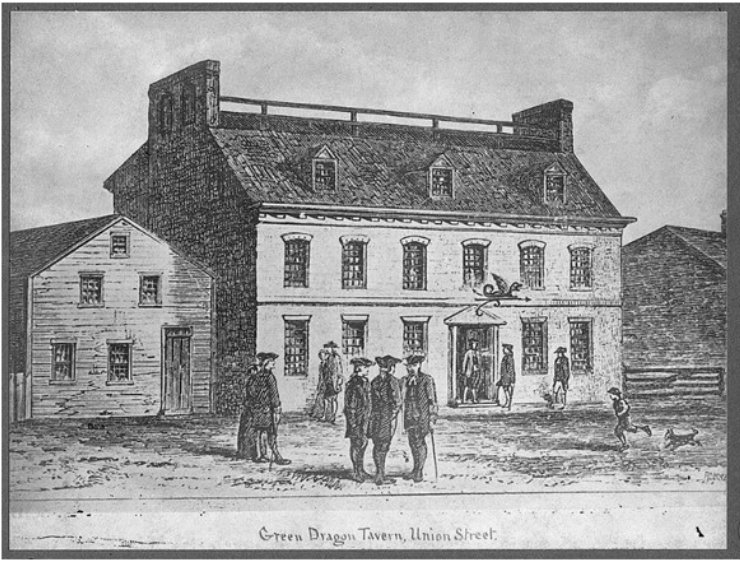
From the West Gate upon entering the Lodge I would see brothers conversing and raising questions on Masonic meanings, ritual, and enjoying the unity of brotherhood. There was no gossip, for there was no verbal communication, it was all done with mental telepathy and kept on the plumb. Upon arriving at ENMI Lodge, more than one brother would introduce and welcome members and visitors alike. It was common to meet a brother from another time or place.

Emmi Lodge continues and we are blessed with Masonic principles and tenets, as well as the many enlightened visitors who share my Lodge and share such interesting facts. I am reminded at each meeting of my obligations and the charges we received during the Masonic Degrees. I am reminded of the duties each mason is charged with, to God, his neighbor and himself. I remind myself I am not to enter countering with the profane concerning Freemasonry. Nor am I to allow or encourage membership of those who will not conform to the Masonic teachings or rules. The lodge continues to entertain guests of my lodge, not only famous but men, as those who like me strive to be better, better men, better husbands, fathers, and Masons.

This evening Paul Revere joined our group. He began with a take on the Wordsworth Poem, "Listen my brothers and you shall hear several facts of Paul Revere." We were apprised of the Man, Mason, and Patriot. Paul Revere was born in Boston Northend in 1735. His father was a Huguenot and arrived in Boston in that same year. His father was a silversmith and Paul became an apprentice at age 13. Being a silversmith, he became known and knew a cross section of Boston Society. His father died in 1754 and Paul continued his apprenticeship but was not the Master of his Fathers silversmith shop. In 1755 Paul enlisted in the Provincial Army and fought 7 years as a 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt. of an artillery regiment. He spent the summer at Ft. William Henry on the south end of Lake George, New York. He was discharged from the Militia. Paul recalled that he was not a particularly good soldier. He returned to Boston and assumed ownership of the Silversmith shop. Paul Revere would be a craftsman, merchant, Freemason, Patriot, and a folk hero. He married Sarah Orne in 1755 and had 8 children. He became a Freemason in 1760 and belonged to St. Andrews Lodge chartered by the Grand Lodge of Scotland in 1756. He was 25 years old and was active as a member and officer for 40 years. He remarked that being Grand Master in 1799 gave him the greatest happiness of his life.

## The Green Dragon Inn Boston Massachusetts. Tavern and St Andrews Lodge Meeting Place

In the summer of 1765, he was a member of Loyal 9 and the Sons of Liberty which were birthed by The Stamp Act of 1765. This was the first direct tax imposed on the 13 American colonies by the Parliament of Great Britain. The phrase Taxation without representation was heard. On August 14, 1765, a group of the Sons of Liberty thought to be made up of some Freemasons burned the King in effigy at Fort Hill and proceeded to the Boston Docks dressed as Indians and threw the cargo of tea in the Harbor. The three ships that were attacked that night were from the East India Trading Company, the vessels Beaver, Dartmouth and Eleanor. Tea was from China, not India. In total there were 340 Cases of loose tea equaling 600,000 lbs of tea. Benjamin Woods Labaree's, "**The Boston Tea Party**" book explains the three tea ships contained 240 chests of Bohea, 15 of Congou, 10 of Souchong (all black teas), 60 of Singlo, and 15 of Hyson (both green teas). ## Indians Throw Tea into the Boston Harbor.

On August 17, a blockade was placed in Boston Harbor. In October 1765, delegates from the colonies convened in New York City at the Stamp Act Congress, where they drew up formal petitions to the British Parliament and to King George III to repeal the act.

The gathering of the 13 colonies would be a precursor to what was to come, The Declaration of Independence. Boston took the brunt of the attack from Britain and the Colonies. With the Revolutionary War rising March 5, 1770, the Boston Massacre would be stained into Massachusetts History. During the 1770s the 1<sup>st</sup> Continental Congress would meet, and all 13 colonies were represented. The business of the day consisted of the laws imposed upon the colonies at this time. In 1775, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Continental Congress would meet and start the question of Independence. Paul Revere's Midnight Ride began around 11 pm and Revere rode a horse borrowed from John Larkin. His report was an alert given to Minutemen in the Province of Massachusetts Bay by local Patriots on the night of April 18, 1775. The signal was placed in the Church Steeple: 1 lantern light by land and 2 lantern lights if by sea. Two lanterns were shown that night. The two lanterns were lit and hung in the steeple by Robert Newman Ruggles and Robert Newman Sheet. Through close calls from Boston to Lexington Paul Revere Road.



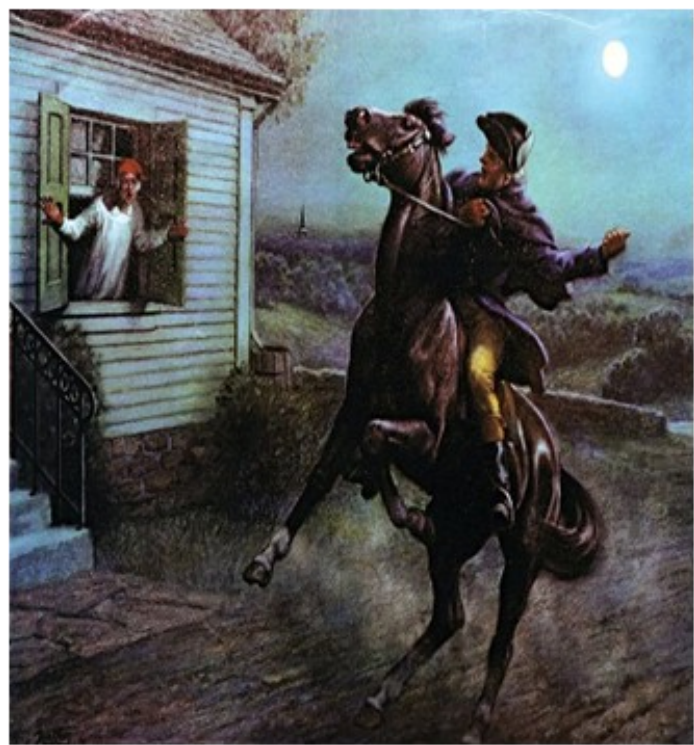
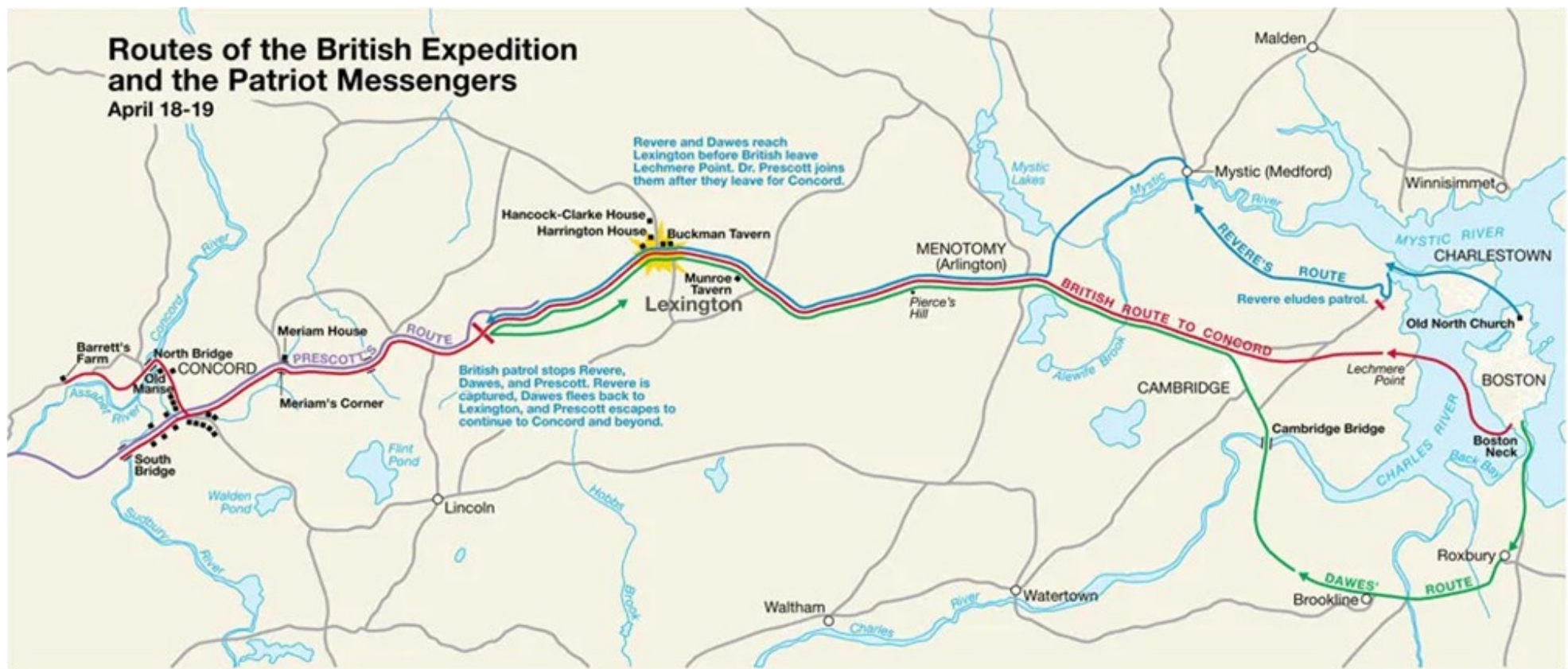

With Williams Dawes, after a brief stay, the pair departed to continue the mission. They would later be joined by Dr. Samuel Prescott on the road to Concord. Paul

reminded us that he did not go through the towns yelling “The British are Coming” because the towns and inns may well have Tories, British sympathizers living there. It was communicated to the people he knew. There is no doubt that his ride was important and certainly was important data to be disseminated. “I never thought of myself as a hero or really a patriot. I knew I was a patriot for the company I kept and my beliefs. There were many like me and many would have done as I did.” We did not know at the time that in 2024 The United States would be a leading Power, nor could we imagine the concerns and problems the “experiment” has been through. It was on the skirts of Enlightenment, and we all felt there was more to life than being under the Crown of England. America was a new land, with new customs and the people were different and it needed a new governance. We understood what we had, and we knew what we wanted.



## The British are Coming!

While Wordsworth’s poem makes Paul Revere a folk hero, parts are not true. But as the newsman said in “The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance”, between printing the facts or the Legend, always print the Legend.

- It should be noted that the night of the Boston Tea Party the Freemasons Lodge Meeting was cancelled due to low attendance.
- Cooper Samuel Peck, active in both St Andrew and the North End Caucus, asked in a town meeting earlier that day if ‘tea was miserable in salt water.’
- Rally Mohawks – bring out your axes!  
And tell King George We will pay no taxes...  
Then rally boys and hasten on  
To meet our chiefs of the Green Dragon  
Our WARREN’s there, and bold REVERE.<sup>39</sup>
